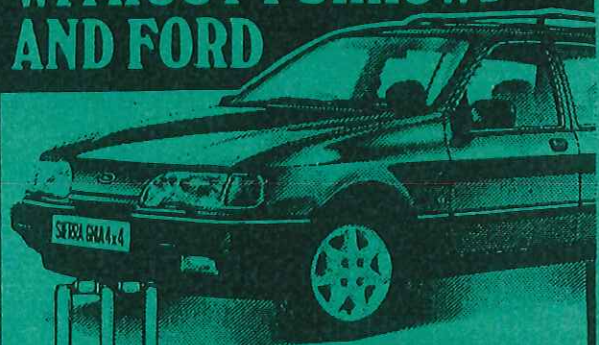

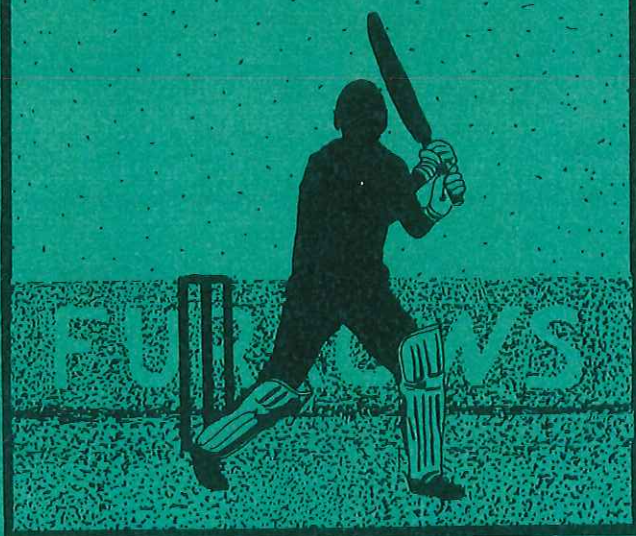

FOREWORD

The 1991 season sees the introduction of a new format for our League. This has become known as 'streaming' and brings together all clubs' first elevens into Divisions One to Four with the second, third and fourth elevens forming a separate structure comprising Reserve Divisions One to Four. This change has been proposed for nearly three years and, although it is fair to say that it has met a certain amount of opposition, the Executive Committee has given the go-ahead by January's E.G.M.

One other change for 1991 is that the Finals of both the Village and League Knock-out competitions will be played on a one innings, 40 overs per side, basis. Otherwise, League playing rules and regulations remain as previously. Whilst on this topic, I would comment that I share the views of those who believe the enjoyment of cricket is entirely dependent on the approach taken to the game by the respective captains and their fellow performers, whatever regulations are in force.

The highlight of the 1990 campaign was, without doubt, the performance of the League's representative side. After a couple of barren seasons, the Midlands Conference Trophy was captured for the sixth time in eleven summers. The final at Edgbaston saw a reasonably comfortable eight wicket success over the Debenham Tewson Cheshire League. Incidentally, it was most gratifying to see so many Shropshire followers in attendance at Birmingham and I am sure that this was much appreciated by both players and League officials.

I would like to take this opportunity once again to extend grateful thanks to our chief sponsors, the Furrows Group, along with Peter Wilkinson and the Shropshire Star and Journal newspaper group. Also thanks to those who have taken up advertising space in this publication and all who have in any way supported the League in general. I can assure them all that their contributions are much appreciated. A special mention also to our editor, Brian Kitson, whose efforts are instrumental in the production of this Handbook.

Finally, on behalf of the Executive Committee and myself, I would like to wish players, officials and spectators all that is best in cricket for the 1991 season.

CONSTITUTION

NAME: This organisation to be known as
THE FURROWS SHROPSHIRE CRICKET LEAGUE

OBJECT: To promote the best interests of cricket in Shropshire and to foster and develop amateur talent in the game.

1. MEMBERSHIP

- (a) The League shall consist of a number of Divisions, the composition of which shall be decided by the Executive Committee, but the size of any division shall not exceed 12 teams.
- (b) The team finishing bottom of Division One shall apply in writing for re-election to that Division by 15th October at the latest. The team finishing top of Division Two has an automatic right of application to join Division One. Any other Shropshire League Club applying must have its application in writing to the League Secretary by 15th October at the latest. All applications are to be determined by the Executive Committee by secret ballot.
- (c) The number of Clubs in membership shall only be increased if the Executive Committee on the recommendation and guidance of the Constitution Committee so decide after investigating the merits of each application (status, ground, amenities, facilities, playing strength, etc.)
- (d) Clubs desiring admission to the League must apply in writing to the League Secretary not later than the third Saturday in July of the year preceding that in which they wish to take part.
- (e) Clubs wishing to resign from the League shall give notice in writing to the League Secretary before 31st October in the preceding year.
- (f) The Executive Committee reserves the right to ask any Club to resign if in its opinion the general conduct or appointments of such Club do not satisfy the requirements of the League. In the event of any complaint against a member Club, that Club shall receive 14 days prior notice of the Committee's intention to hear that complaint and will be invited to send representatives to attend that part of the meeting hearing the complaint. This action shall be in addition to any steps taken under "Rules for the Conduct of Matches".
- (g) Any Club ceasing to be a member of the League shall at once forfeit any rights of participation in the assets of the League.

2. FINANCE

- (a) The subscription from each Club shall be £19.00 per team per annum (including a £5 Handbook levy) to be paid not later than 1st May in any year. Clubs not paying their subscriptions by the due date may be charged an extra £1 penalty for every month or part of a month they are in arrears.
- (b) If the income from subscriptions is insufficient to meet League requirements, a further levy may be made on each Club.
- (c) The funds of the League shall be dealt with by and through an account with a Bank in the name of the League. Cheques may be drawn on two signatures. The Chairman, League Secretary and Hon. Treasurer shall be authorised signatories.
- (d) The financial year shall end on 30th September after which the accounts shall be audited by an Hon. Auditor who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.

3. OFFICERS

- (a) Officers of the League shall consist of the President, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary, Hon. Assistant Secretary and Hon. Fixture Secretary, all of whom, with the exception of the President, shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting. The President shall be elected by the Executive Committee.
- (b) Hon. Life Members shall be elected by the Executive Committee in recognition of past services to the League and shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Executive Committee.
- (c) A Hon. Legal Adviser shall be elected by the Executive Committee.

4. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- (a) The League shall be governed by an Executive Committee consisting of the officers named in 3(a) above, ten representatives of Clubs in the First Division and nine representatives from all other divisions.
- (b) Not more than two representatives from any one Club shall serve on this committee, with the exception of the officers named in 3(a) above.
- (c) Nine members shall form a quorum.
- (d) At least seven days notice of meetings shall be given.
- (e) The Executive Committee may appoint such sub-committees as they may from time to time consider necessary.
- (f) A Management Committee shall be formally appointed by the Executive Committee with full power to deal with any matters or issues which may arise and which are not covered by or need adjudication under these rules.
- (g) The Chairman or in his absence the Vice-Chairman, or if both are absent a deputy appointed by the Committee shall preside at all Executive Committee Meetings and shall have a casting vote.
- (h) The decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.
- (i) The Executive Committee shall have power to co-opt.
- (j) Members shall be elected to the Committee for a period of three years after which time they will retire and, if willing, offer themselves for re-election.
- (k) Executive Committee Members should register an attendance figure of at least 50%. Apologies will only be accepted if tendered three days before a meeting with illness as the only legitimate reason for non-attendance. Members failing to reach the 50% attendance level are liable to expulsion.

5. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

- (a) The Annual General Meeting shall be held in November each year.
- (b) Twenty-eight clear days notice of the Annual General Meeting shall be given to all member clubs.
- (c) Nominations for officers and members of the Executive Committee must be received by the League Secretary not later than seven clear days before the date of the Annual General Meeting.
- (d) Proposals for alterations to the constitution must be received by the League Secretary on or before 30th September.
- (e) Proposals for alterations to the constitution must receive two thirds of votes cast before acceptance and can only be considered at an Annual General Meeting or an Extraordinary General Meeting.
- (f) Not more than one representative of each member club will be entitled to vote at the Annual General Meeting. The Chairman shall have the casting vote.

- (g) If it is thought desirable that only certain member clubs should vote on a particular matter, this restriction shall only be permitted with the specific consent of the Annual General Meeting.
- (h) Proxy votes will not be accepted.
- (i) Fifteen member clubs shall form a quorum.
6. EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING
- (a) The Extraordinary General Meeting may be called at the discretion of the Executive Committee or on receipt by the League Secretary of a written request signed by not less than a third of the Member Clubs, stating the reason for which the meeting should be called.
- (b) The provisions applicable to the Annual General Meeting, with the exception of 5(a), shall also apply to an Extraordinary General Meeting whenever such meeting is convened.
7. TROPHIES
- (a) Cups and shields respectively will be awarded at the end of each season to the champions and runners-up in all Divisions.
- (b) In addition there are awards for the 'Young Player of the Year', the batsman who has scored the most runs and the bowler who has taken the most wickets during the season.
- (c) All trophies should be returned to the League Secretary not later than 31st August.
- (d) Clubs winning trophies will be required to sign a document promising to return them in good condition or replace them.
8. FIXTURES
- (a) All League matches will be played on the dates published in the League Handbook unless agreed as in (b) below.
- (b) Clubs wishing to re-arrange a published fixture must BOTH give written notice to the League Secretary not less than ten days before the date of the proposed alteration. Such changes must receive the sanction of the Executive Committee who will only allow them in exceptional circumstances.
- (c) Clubs not fulfilling fixtures shall be fined £10 for a first offence, £25 for a second offence and shall face expulsion from the League for a third offence.
- (d) Clubs will be informed of dates on which a League representative XI may be required. On such notified dates the League will expect their requirements to take preference over any club requirement.
- (e) In the event of a Shropshire League club qualifying for the final of the National Club Championship Trophy, any club desirous of re-arranging their League fixtures for that day may so do.

RULES AND PLAYING ARRANGEMENTS

1. GENERAL
The Rules and Arrangements set out below will apply to all Divisions of the Shropshire League from 1st April, 1991, and will continue until officially amended on the authority of the Executive Committee of the League.
2. QUALIFICATION OF PLAYERS
- (a) No player shall be brought in from an outside League to play in the Shropshire League during the playing season without first obtaining the written consent of the Rules Sub-Committee of the League. An exemption will be made to this rule for clubs with teams competing in another league (i.e. Madeley 3rd XI and Condover 2nd XI).
- (b) A list of playing members for the coming season, from whom teams for the season will be selected, must be submitted to the League Secretary no later than the date of commencement of that season. Any new players must also be registered with the League Secretary.
- (c) Any bona fide member of a club may take part in League matches provided that:
- (i) after transferring from another club in this League he has applied for and obtained the sanction of the Rules Sub-Committee to represent his new Club. Such applications must be received four clear days before his first match with his new club and must be accompanied by a letter from the Secretary of his old club confirming that he has fulfilled his obligations to that Club.
- (ii) if he has played in 12 or more first team matches, he shall not be allowed to play in any of the last three matches in a lower division or in a second team match without the approval of the Rules Sub-Committee.
- (iii) if he has played in 12 or more first or second team matches, he shall not be allowed to play in any of the last three matches in a lower division without the approval of the Rules Sub-Committee.
3. RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF ALL MATCHES
- (a) All teams shall play each other on a home and away basis, fixtures being arranged by the League Fixture Secretary between mid-April and mid-September. All fixtures shall take place on a Saturday unless clubs are desirous of re-arranging a fixture after they have been published. In this case BOTH clubs must give written notice to the League Secretary not less than ten days before the date of the proposed alteration and must be granted permission before carrying out any change. Any infringement of this rule will result in the match being declared void.
- (b) Matches shall be played in accordance with the LAWS of CRICKET subject to such specific points as are hereinafter stipulated.
- (c) No underarm bowling will be allowed in the League.
- (d) The Executive Committee shall have the discretion to call a match void if they deem it necessary and may award or deduct points at their discretion.
4. HOURS AND CONDITIONS OF PLAY
- (a) All matches shall commence at 2.00 p.m. except in September when all matches shall commence at 1.00 p.m.
- (b) Prompt starts are essential and the toss for innings shall take place at least fifteen minutes before the scheduled starting time. In the event of a team not being able to comply, the opposing team may, if it so wishes, exercise the right to claim the toss. Clubs who arrive late without a satisfactory explanation will be dealt with by the Executive Committee who may deduct two points from the record of the offending club.

- (c) (i) The duration of play shall be limited to 100 six-ball overs with an interval of 20 minutes for tea between innings.
- (ii) The side batting first shall receive not more than 50 overs.
- (iii) The other side shall, in addition to its 50 overs, utilise the balance, if any, of that same quota not used by the side batting first. In this case, any odd balls bowled shall constitute a complete over.
- (iv) In conjunction with the scorers, the umpires shall ensure that the recording of overs and runs is correctly made and adequately displayed.
Before the first ball of the last over of each innings, the umpires shall call 'last over' clearly so that both sides understand.
- (v) Captains may agree to reduce the overs before the toss takes place if in their opinion the weather conditions so indicate. In these circumstances the provisions of Rule 5 will have no bearing unless 30 minutes have been lost. The minimum number of overs to constitute a match to be forty.
- (vi) No match shall start after 5.00 p.m. (4.00 p.m. in September)

5. INTERRUPTION OF PLAY

- (a) In the event of interference by weather, light or unforeseen circumstances amounting to 30 minutes or more after the scheduled starting time (2.00 p.m. April to August and 1.00 p.m. September), play shall cease at 8.30 p.m. during the months of April to August inclusive with a minimum of 20 overs being bowled from 7.30 p.m. or on completion of the number of overs that constitute that particular match. In September, play shall cease at 7.30 p.m. with a minimum of 20 overs being bowled from 6.30 p.m. or on completion of the number of overs that constitute that particular match.
If a further interruption of play occurs during the final 20 overs, the number of overs will be reduced by one over for every full three minutes lost. If the reduced number of overs are completed before 8.30 p.m. (7.30 p.m. in September), play will continue until 8.30 p.m. (7.30 p.m. in September).
The time lost is to be noted by the umpires and allowed for in the calculation of the over rate.
- (b) If, at the scheduled finishing times in (a) above, the side batting second still occupy the crease, and have received at least as many overs as the side batting first, then the game shall be a draw and the points allocated in accordance with Rule 6.
- (c) If the side batting second do not receive as many overs as the side batting first then the game shall be abandoned.
- (d) If a bowler is incapacitated during an over, that over shall be completed by any member of the fielding side other than he who bowled the previous over.

6. ALLOCATION OF POINTS

WIN: 6 points to the winning side.
TIE: 3 points to each side only when scores are equal and the team batting second are all out or have used their allocation of overs (Subject to Rule 5 (b) and 5 (c)).
NOT STARTED: 1 point to each side.
ABANDONED: 1 point to each side.
DRAW: 4 points to the side scoring the greater number of runs and 1 point to the other side when the agreed number of overs have been bowled without a definite result having been achieved. (Subject to Rule 5 (b) and 5 (c)).

OVER RATE: Overs are required to be bowled at 18 per hour and each club's rate will be reviewed halfway through the season and again at the end of the season.

At each review any club which has not attained an average over rate of 18 per hour will have 6 points deducted from their accumulation of points to date.

The rate for the first innings will be taken from 2.00 p.m. and the second innings from 20 minutes after the completion of the first innings.

N.B. This Rule applies in Division One and Reserve Division only.

7. THE BALL

Two new balls purchased through the League shall be used in all Division One games. One new ball purchased through the League shall be used in all Division Two, Three and Four games. Any Club not having paid for its allocation by the due date shall be liable to a surcharge of £10. In all Reserve Divisions, a new ball need not be provided for every match but the ball to be used shall be in good condition and of good quality. This shall be submitted to and approved by the Captains before the toss.

8. QUALIFICATION OF UMPIRES

- (a) An umpire may be required to satisfy the Rules Sub-Committee as to his competence either on appointment or at any time thereafter.
- (b) If one side provides an umpire and the other side does not provide one, that one umpire should be the official umpire for the match and should stand at the bowler's end throughout the match.
- (c) Umpires should be responsible for noting and recording the over rate - viz. overs bowled and time taken - and will be required to note this information on the official League Score Sheet.
- (d) The Shropshire Association of Cricket Umpires will be responsible for appointing umpires to all Division One and League Knockout fixtures.
- (e) No fee as such is payable to umpires appointed from the panel. Expenses will be met by the Shropshire Association of Cricket Umpires with all Division One Clubs being expected to submit, on request, a one-off payment to the Shropshire A.C.U. to cover such costs.

9. PREPARATION OF PITCHES

- (a) Preparation of pitches must be in accordance with the M.C.C. Laws and Instruction. Pitches should not be watered in the 48 hour period preceding any match.
- (b) Pitches may be wholly covered at all times where possible. Before the toss is made, the home Captain should advise his opposite number whether covers are available.

10. PLAYERS CROSSING

- (a) The attention of Captains is drawn to Note 2(b) of Law 31, whereby it is one of their duties to ensure the incoming batsman passes the outgoing one before the latter leaves the field of play.

11. CANCELLATION OF MATCHES

In the event of any ground being unfit for play owing to weather or other circumstances it shall be the responsibility of the home club to inform the visiting club of this fact.

This should be carried out on the day of the match NOT before 11.00 a.m. and NOT later than 12.00 noon. (10.00 a.m. and 11.00 a.m. in September).

12. NOTIFICATION OF RESULTS

It shall be the responsibility of the home club to send full details of the match played on the score sheet issued by the League which is signed by both Captains. This score sheet must reach the League Secretary by the first post each Thursday after the match has been played. Failure to comply with this rule will result in two points being deducted from the offending club

13. PROTEST

- (a) Any protest shall be lodged with the League Secretary in writing within four days following the match.
- (b) A copy of such protest shall be sent to the club against whom the protest is made.
- (c) Each protest is to be accompanied by a fee of £5 which shall be forfeited if the Disputes Sub-Committee deems the protest to be trivial.
- (d) The club sustaining the protest or objection shall have the points added to its total points gained, but such points not to exceed the maximum for a win. The club against whom the protest has been made to lose any points gained and to be fined the number of points equivalent to a win.
- (e) Clubs when making a protest shall state under which rule the protest is made.

14. DISPUTES

Any dispute having reference to the Laws of Cricket shall be referred to the Cricket Council for settlement and their decision shall be final, but in all other matters the decision of the League shall be final.

15. LEAGUE POSITIONAL PLACINGS

In the event of two or more teams finishing on the same number of points at the end of a season, the following factors shall be used to determine final placings: firstly - most wins; if still equal - least defeats; if still equal - most winning draws; if still equal - most away wins. In the event of these four instances not separating the teams, the points tally of League matches played that season between the teams involved shall determine the final League placings.

16. These rules are binding on all players and clubs in the Furrows Shropshire Cricket League and the Executive Committee may take action against defaulting clubs or players.

KNOCKOUT COMPETITION RULES

1. **Object**

The object of the competition is to promote an eleven-a-side evening Knock-out competition among member clubs of the League. The games will be played according to the M.C.C. Laws of Cricket (1980 Code) modified as under 3 below.
2. **Organisation**

The Shropshire League Knock-out competition shall be open to the twelve Division One clubs together with the four clubs emerging from the qualifying competition to be known as the Shropshire League Village Knock-out. This will be open to all Division Two, Three and Four Clubs and arranged on an area basis with two clubs emerging from each of two zones. These four qualifiers will also compete as semi-finalists in the Village Knock-out.
3. **Rules**
 - Law 1
 - (a) Each player must be a member of the club he represents and a current Shropshire League player as defined under League rules.
 - (b) A player who is a member of more than one club can play only for one club in the competition.
 - (c) Any team failing to fulfil a fixture at any stage of either competition shall be automatically excluded from the following year's competition and will also be barred from entry in future years. Applications for re-admittance must be made to the League Executive Committee by no later than 1st October in the preceding year.
 - Law 3
 - (a) Umpires should note that no appeal against the light shall be allowed after the commencement of the second innings unless both captains agree that further play is undesirable.
 - Law 5
 - (a) A new ball will not be used, but a suitable re-polished or re-varnished ball of sound quality, which is acceptable to both captains, will be used throughout the game.
 - Law 12
 - (a) Excepting Finals, each side will have one innings consisting of twenty six-ball overs.
 - (b) Provided that both captains agree prior to the commencement of play, the match may be contested over a lesser number of overs in the event of bad weather or a late start.
 - (c) Before the toss for innings, the umpires shall acquaint themselves with the number of overs agreed upon by the two captains.
 - Law 16
 - (a) The interval between each innings shall be not more than ten minutes.
 - Law 21
 - (a) A match is won by the side scoring the higher number of runs in the agreed number of overs. In the event of scores being level, the side losing fewer wickets shall be declared the winner. If this is also equal, the side scoring the greater number of runs in the first ten overs (or at the half way point in their innings if different) shall be the winner. If this is also equal, the match is tied and will be replayed on a ground chosen by the visiting team.
 - Law 22
 - (a) No bowler may bowl more than five overs out of the allotted twenty. If a match of fewer overs is agreed upon, no bowler may bowl more than one quarter of the total.
 - Law 25
 - (a) In addition to the normal provisions of this law the umpire shall call and signal "wide ball" if the ball passes more than 18" outside the batsman's pads (to the legside), when he is standing at his normal position at the crease.

Restriction on placement of fielders (League K.O. only)

At the instant of delivery, a minimum of four fielders (plus bowler and wicket-keeper) must be within an area bounded by two semi-circles, centred on each middle stump, each with a radius of 30 yards and joined by a parallel line on each side of the pitch. In the event of an infringement the square-leg umpire shall call "no-ball".

The fielding circles may be marked by white painted dots at five yard intervals or if possible by white plastic or rubber (not metal) discs measuring approximately seven inches in diameter.

4. **Fixtures**
 - (a) Both Village Knock-out and League Knock-out competitions shall be pre-drawn as far as the semi-final stages and the full draw will be notified to all clubs by the preceding 1st March and printed in the League Handbook.
 - (b) The matches shall be played on the ground chosen by the side drawn as the home side.
 - (c) Each round of both competitions will be played on a conference date specified by the Knock-out Sub-Committee and printed in the League Handbook. However, in the event of both teams agreeing, the match may be played on an earlier date than that which is laid down in the Rules providing the League Secretary is notified at least forty-eight hours prior to any such rearranged match.
 - (d) In the event of inclement weather not allowing the match to be completed on the conference date, a revised date (within seven days of the original) must be agreed by both clubs immediately and communicated within 24 hours to a member of the Knockout Sub-Committee by the home club. Failure to agree on a new date will result in the Knockout Sub-Committee defining a date on which the match shall take place.
 - (e) No match shall be played after the conference date - other than one rearranged under Rule 4(d). If it is found that clubs do arrange a match after the conference date, both clubs will be expelled from the competition.
 - (f) If either club is unable to play on the conference date and are not able to agree an earlier date they shall forfeit the match.
 - (g) Matches shall normally commence not later than 6.30 p.m. on the day arranged. The umpires shall call play not later than 6.45 p.m. and any side refusing to play shall lose the match.
 - (h) Prompt starts are essential and the toss for innings shall take place at least fifteen minutes before the scheduled starting time of 6.30 p.m. (6.15 p.m. for League Knock-out). In the event of a team not being available to comply, the opposing team may, if it so wishes, exercise the right to claim the toss.
 - (i) The winning clubs - in each round of both competitions - shall notify the League Secretary of the result within 48 hours of the fixture taking place.
5. **Finals**
 - (a) The finals of both competitions shall be played on an afternoon basis on dates to be ratified by the Knock-out Sub-Committee.
 - (b) A neutral ground selected by the Knock-out Sub-Committee shall be used. In the event of no ground being available the two sides will toss a coin to decide on a venue of the winner's choosing.
 - (c) The finals shall be played over one innings each side of forty overs. No bowler may bowl more than eight overs of the forty.
 - (d) In the event of the scores being equal at the end of the match the side losing fewer wickets shall be declared the winner. If this is also equal, the side scoring the greater number of runs in the first twenty overs of their innings shall be the winner. If this is also equal, the final shall be replayed.
 - (e) The league will provide two new balls of good quality for each final.
 - (f) The members of teams competing in finals will be presented with small trophies as mementoes of the occasion.
6. **Umpires**
 - (a) All League Knockout matches shall be taken charge of by umpires appointed by the Shropshire Association of Cricket Umpires.
 - (b) Umpires for the semi-finals and final of the Village Knockout will be appointed by the Shropshire Association of Cricket Umpires.
 - (c) On request, the Shropshire Association of Cricket Umpires will also endeavour to supply umpires for the qualifying rounds of the Village Knockout.

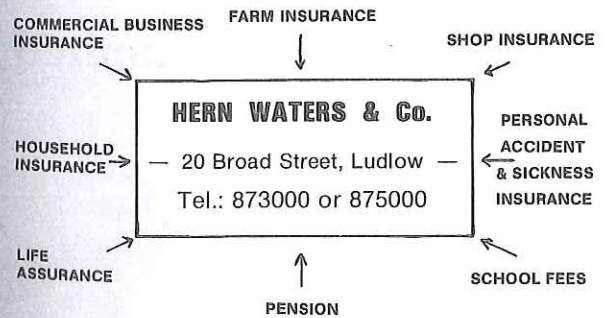
