"I would encourage all clubs to take a look at the presentation for ideas of possible funding sources to help them through this period."



"But this competition has generated a huge amount of interest when we announced the plans and the squads earlier in the year, so we hope we can get it off the ground later in the summer.

"That might mean playing at a weekend in September rather than evenings in mid-Summer, but it should still be a great spectacle. And thanks to sponsors Strategic Leisure who are still fully behind the project!"

In the meantime, the four sides – Northern Force, Iron Maidens, Southern Steamers and Severn Storm – have launched a logo design competition for youngsters aged 16 and under across the county.

Henshalls Shropshire League update

collowing on from the club survey run by Cricket Shropshire, the Henshalls Shropshire County Cricket League has replied to some of the points raised.

Mike Hall said: "Thank you for completing the survey, and whilst there is no point in speculating on when (or if) the 2020

season will start we are in a position to provide some answers in principle to the following concerns that you have raised:-



FORMAT

In the event that a start can be made this season the format will depend on timing of the start and any health and safety/travel conditions imposed by the Government. Promotion & relegation will not apply during a reduced season but, as is usual practice, the league reserves the right to make changes to the structure in 2021 once final numbers are confirmed. The League would not penalise clubs who were unable to raise a team for a reduced

programme of fixtures. If there is not time for a reduced League programme to be arranged it may be possible for friendlies to be played subject, of course, to complying with whatever Government conditions are in place at the time.

CRICKET BALLS

The cricket balls will be the same for the 2021 season and buy back/carry forward options will be available to clubs in all circumstances.

PRE-SEASON DECLARATION FORM

This has not been issued for the 2020 Season. In the event that a start can be made a Pre-season Declaration Form would be tailored to the relevant Government conditions in place at the time.

OTHER MATTERS

Update on delivery of cricket balls. The Dukes County International cricket balls are currently being delivered to clubs and the BAS Test cricket balls should be delivered within the next 21 days but a further update will be issued when delivery details are confirmed.

Shrewsbury & District Evening League

The Shrewsbury & District Evening League chairman Ray Collins has also provided an update for clubs following the survey.

He said: "The S&DECL are closely monitoring the Government guidelines and will continue to be guided by them and the ECB.

"The most optimistic view as cricket "die hard" would hope for half a season, with no promotion and relegation, that said it appears this will be unlikely.

"There are no plans for the cup competition and the season wouldn't be extended due to the fading light in August."

"Maybe the best we could hope for were a few a friendlies towards the end of the season which we would happily facilitate if required.

" We will continue our dialogue with other Leagues and SCB"
