### FOREWORD

Nineteen ninety-eight was the second year of Banks's sponsorship of the League, and I am pleased to be able to report another successful season - one which brought progress in a number of important areas.

For one transitional year only, Division One was increased in size to 20 clubs and was comfortably won by a Broseley team strengthened by the addition of the young Pakistani Test batsman, Hasan Raza. For 1999, Broseley will move forward to the Furrows League as the new pyramid system starts to take effect.

The advent of the new pyramid system is just one of a number of important changes which will further improve the quality of cricket played throughout the county. Our League will continue to offer a free ground advisory service to encourage clubs to embark upon more improvement projects. Such projects must be regarded as investments for the future in order to encourage more people to play cricket, especially

In this area, I am proud to say that the Banks's League has taken a huge step forward by organising a new Under-15 League, comprising 2 regionalised divisions and involving 10 teams. Congratulations therefore to the inaugural winners Knockin, and the beaten finalists Pontesbury.

As the League continues its development, I must pay tribute to Mike Teece who has decided to relinquish his place on the Committee after some 28 years of loyal service. Mike's service to Shropshire cricket in general and to this League in particular has been immense and his presence will be greatly missed in the future; everyone that knows him will wish him well for the future.

Nineteen ninety-nine will bring further challenges to our League in a number of different areas. In the first instance, I hope that the Banks's League will continue to play its part in the development of the new pyramid system - clubs will be encouraged to continue their improvements to their facilities. Secondly, the League will be welcoming back into its fold the 3rd and 4th XIs of the Furrows League - they will compete as a parallel division to Division 4. Finally, and I think most importantly, I hope that the Youth League will grow, bringing competitive junior cricket to even more of our Shropshire towns and villages.

It remains for me to thank my hard-working Committee, who have again given me great support; John Rees, as always, has provided wonderful service for the whole of our League. I must also thank our sponsors Banks's, and the local press for their collective coverage of our League. Finally, I am indebted to our President the Lord Forester for his commitment to our League.

### CONSTITUTION

### NAME

The organisation shall be known as The Shropshire Cricket League Sponsored by Banks's, hereafter referred to as "the League".

To promote and develop the best interests of cricket in Shropshire and its bordering counties.

### MEMBERSHIP

- The League shall consist of member Clubs who satisfy the requirements of the League and Management Committee, hereafter referred to as "the Committee", with regard to status, playing strength and standard of grounds and facilities.
- All member clubs must be affiliated to their relevant Cricket Board. Failure to do so could result in expulsion from the League.

  The teams of member Clubs shall play in Divisions, as determined by the

- Committee.

  (d) There shall normally be promotion and relegation between Divisions. In exceptional circumstances the Committee may make other arrangements and shall notify all member Clubs of its decision.

  (e) Any club desiring admission to, or any member Club seeking to change the number of its teams in, the League, shall apply in writing to the League Secretary not later than 15th October, indicating the number of teams it wishes to enter next season. Each application shall be considered by the Committee in accordance with the requirements of Clauses 3(a) 3(b) and 3(c) above. In exceptional circumstances, applications received after the closing date may be considered.

  (f) Any member Club wishing to resign from the League shall give notice in
- Any member Club wishing to resign from the League shall give notice in writing to the League Secretary not later than 15th October. Clauses 3(e) and 3(f) above shall not apply to any club promoted to or relegated from another recognised League forming part of the E.C.B. pyramid structure.
- A member Club which removes its first team from the League shall be deemed to have resigned its membership: it may, however, apply to re-enter one or more of its lower teams and the application will be considered in accordance with the requirements of Clause 3(e) above.
- The Committee shall have powers to require any member Club to resign from the League if, in its opinion, its general conduct or appointments do not satisfy the requirements of the League. Any member Club against which such action is proposed shall receive not less than 14 days notice in writing of the proposed action and shall be entitled to be represented at that part of the Committee meeting at which the matter is to be considered.

  Any Club which ceases to be a member of the League shall at note feefal.
- Any Club which ceases to be a member of the League shall at once forfeit any rights of participation in the assets of the League. Following a recommendation from the Committee, the Annual General Meeting may confer the honour of Life Membership of the League on any person whom it considers worthy of special recognition by reason of services rendered to the League.

### MANAGEMENT

Subject to the provisions of this Constitution, the control and management of the League shall be vested in the Management Committee, which shall make rules governing the general principles of the conduct of the League's affairs and shall have the powers to apply, create, alter or revoke such rules as it sees fit. The Committee shall have the power to convene a Special General Meeting of member Clubs.

### MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

- The Committee shall consist of ex officio the Officers in 6(a) below and fifteen elected Members.
- One-third of the elected Members shall be elected at each Annual General Meeting for a term of three years, after which time they shall retire from the Committee and, if they wish, offer themselves for re-election.

  Not more than two elected Members from the same Club shall serve on the
- Not more than two elected wiembers from the same club shall serve on the Committee at the same time.

  At least seven days notice of meetings shall be given. Accidental omission to give notice of any meeting or non-receipt of such notice by any Committee member shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting.
- Committee member shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting. The Chairman shall preside at meetings of the Committee. If the Chairman is absent the Vice-Chairman shall preside: If both are absent, the Committee members present shall, before any other business is transacted, choose one of their number to preside at the meeting. One-third of the Committee shall form a quorum. All questions arising at a Committee meeting, other than questions of order, shall be decided by a simple majority of votes: in the event of an equality of votes, the chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote. Committee members shall "declare an interest" when an issue directly affecting their own club is to be discussed and shall normally abstain from any vote on such matter.

- The Committee may appoint sub-committees with such powers and terms of reference as it thinks fit.
- The Committee shall have power to co-opt to fill a vacancy. Co-opted members shall serve until the next Annual General Meeting when the vacancy shall be filled by election.
- The decision of the Committee is final.
- Committee members are expected to attend all of its meetings. Anyone who fails to attend three or more consecutive meetings is liable to expulsion from the Committee.
- (m) Any Committee member whose club ceases to be a member of the League may be required, at the discretion of the Committee, to resign his position.

- The Officers of the League shall be the President, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, League Secretary. Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Fixture Secretary.
- (b) The Officers shall be elected annually at, and shall take office from the end of, the Annual General Meeting.

- (a) Each member Club shall pay to the Honorary Treasurer, hereafter referred to as "the Treasurer", not later than the end of April, an annual subscription for each team. Any club which fails to pay by the due date may be charged an additional penalty for each month or part of a month that it is in arrears. The amounts of the subscription and the penalty will be determined each year by the Committee and notified to all member Clubs.

  (b) If the subscription income is found to be insufficient to meet the League's needs, the Committee may levy an additional subscription on member Clubs.
- The Committee shall cause proper account to be kept of all sums of money received and paid out by the League.
- The financial year of the League shall end on 31st October.

  The accounts of the League shall be examined annually by a qualified accountant, who shall certify their correctness.

  A statement of accounts shall be presented by the Treasurer to the Annual General Meeting.

The funds of the League shall be invested as the Committee decides after considering the recommendations of the Treasurer and the day-to-day transactions shall be dealt with by and through one or more Bank accounts in the name of the League. No moneys shall be paid from any account in the name of the League except upon the signatures of any two from the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, League Secretary and Treasurer who shall be the authorised signatories.

### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

(a) The Annual General Meeting, hereafter referred to as "the Meeting", shall be held in November each year or as practicable thereafter.

(b) Notice of the Meeting shall be given in writing to all member Clubs at least twenty-eight days before the date thereof.

(c) The President shall preside at the Meeting. If the President is absent the Chairman shall preside; if all are absent, the member Clubs present shall, before any other business is transacted, appoint a chairman of the Meeting.

(d) Nominations for President. Chairman, Vice-Chairman, League Secretary, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Fixture Secretary and elected Members of the Committee shall be submitted in writing by member Clubs and received by the League Secretary at least seven days before the Meeting.

(e) Each member Club shall have one vote. In the event of an equality of votes, the chairman of the Meeting shall have a single casting vote.

(f) Proxy votes will not be accepted.

(g) The Constitution may be altered at an Annual General Meeting or Special Constitution and the standard and

Proxy votes will not be accepted.

The Constitution may be altered at an Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting only and such alteration shall require the assent of at least two-thirds of the votes cast.

Proposals to alter the Constitution must either be submitted by the Committee or be proposed and seconded by at least two member Clubs and received by the League Secretary not later than 30th September. The wording of any such proposed alteration to the Constitution shall be included in the Notice of Meeting.

One-third of the member Clubs shall form a quorum.

### SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

(a) A Special General Meeting shall be called at the discretion of the Committee or on receipt by the League Secretary of a written request, signed by not less than one-third of member Clubs, stating the reason(s) why the meeting is being requested.

(b) The provisions applicable to the Annual General Meeting shall, with the exception of 8(a) and 8(h) above, apply also to the Special General Meeting.

(c) Proposals to alter the Constitution must either be submitted by the Committee or be proposed and seconded by at least two member Clubs and submitted to the League Secretary. The wording of any such proposed alteration to the Constitution shall be included in the Notice of Meeting.

### 10. TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded to the Champions and Runners-up in all Divisions. Additional awards may be made at the Committee's discretion. Trophies remain the property of the League and must be returned in good condition to the League Secretary not later than 30th September. Any member Club failing to do so may be invoiced for the cost of a replacement.

All League matches shall be played on the published dates.

Any Club which fails to fulfil a fixture shall be fined on a sliding scale for a first and second offence and is liable to be expelled from the League for a third offence in any one season. The amount of the fines shall be determined from time to time by the Committee and member Clubs shall be notified.

(c) Member Clubs will be informed of the dates on which a League Representative XI may be taking part in a Competition. Clubs should not under any circumstances withdraw a player selected to represent the League in favour of a Club competition.

### 12. WINDING UP

The League may be wound up only by the passing of a resolution by a majority of at least two-thirds of the member Clubs present and voting at a Special General Meeting convened for the purpose of considering such resolution.

resolution.

(b) In the event of the passing of a resolution to wind up the League, the meeting at which such resolution is passed shall appoint a committee which shall be empowered to distribute the League's assets, including cash and investments, between member Clubs, or other organisations having similar aims and objects as the League, in such proportions as they may, by simple majority, decide, provided that the same shall not be paid to, or divided between, any individual members of the Committee or the Officers. The Chairman, League Secretary and Honorary Treasurer shall be ex officion members of that committee. In the event of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

(c) In the event that such committee is unable to reach a decision with regard.

In the event that such committee is unable to reach a decision with regard to the distribution of the assets, the Chairman shall have power to refer the matter to an independent arbitrator, the costs, if any, of such arbitration being a proper charge on the assets of the League.

### RULES AND PLAYING ARRANGEMENTS

The Rules and Playing Arrangements set out below apply to all Divisions of the Shropshire Cricket League and will continue in force until officially amended on the authority of the Management Committee of the League.

These Rules are binding on all players and clubs in the Shropshire Cricket League and the Management Committee may take action against defaulting clubs or players.

The subscription shall be £19.00 per team, to be paid to the Treasurer not later than 1st May, by Direct Debit or Standing Order if possible. (See also Rule 14.1.)

- QUALIFICATION OF PLAYERS

  2.1 No player shall be brought in from an outside League to play in the Shropshire League during the season without first obtaining the written consent of the Rules Sub-Committee of the League. Subject, however, to Rules 2.2, 2.3.2 and 2.3.3, the 3rd and 4th teams of Furrows League clubs may use players from their 2nd team.
- their 2nd team.

  2.2 A list of playing members for the current season, from whom teams for the current season will be selected, must be submitted to the League Secretary not later than 31st May. Failure to comply may mean that teams will accrue no points thereafter until a registered list of players is submitted. Any new players must be registered with the League Secretary after any such list is submitted. No permission will be granted to register players after 1st August.

  2.2.1 In exceptional circumstances players may be registered by 12 noon on the day of the game with the permission of a member of the Disputes.
- 2.2.2 Transfer forms, issued by the League, are to be completed by both clubs and acknowledged by the Rules Sub-Committee before players are eligible to play any such transfers are to be completed within seven days.

  2.3 Any bona fide member of a club may take part in League matches provided that:

  2.3.1 If transferring from another club in this League, he has applied for and obtained the sanction of the Rules Sub-Committee to represent his new club. Such applications must be received seven clear days before his first match with his new club and must be accompanied by a letter from the Secretary of his previous club confirming that he has fulfilled his obligations to that club.

  2.3.2 If he has played in 12 or more first team matches during the season, he shall not be allowed to play in any of the last three matches in a lower division or in a second team match without the approval of the Rules Sub-Committee.

  2.3.3 If he has played in 12 or more first or second team matches during the season.

  - 2.3.3 If he has played in 12 or more first or second team matches during the season, he shall not be allowed to play in any of the last three matches in a lower division without the approval of the Rules Sub-Committee.

### RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF ALL MATCHES

- RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF ALL MATCHES

  3.1 All teams shall play each other, fixtures being arranged by the league Fixture Secretary between mid-April and mid-September. All fixtures shall take place on a Saturday unless clubs are desirous of re-arranging a fixture after they have been published. In this case both clubs must give written notice to the League Secretary not less than ten days before the date of the proposed alteration and must be granted permission before carrying out any change. Any infringement of this rule will result in the match being declared void.

  3.2 Matches shall be played in accordance with the Laws of Cricket subject to such specific points as are hereinafter stipulated.

  3.3 No underarm bowling shall be allowed in the League.
  3.4 The Management Committee shall have the powers to call a match void if it deems it necessary and may award or deduct points at its discretion.
  3.5 Any club which intends to call off a match for reasons other than provided for in Rule 10 shall cancel its 2nd team game in preference to that of its 1st team; and similarly with the the 3rd and 4th teams of Furrows League clubs. (See also Rule 14.2.)

### 4. HOURS AND CONDITIONS OF PLAY

- All matches up to and including the second Saturday in August shall commence at 2.00 p.m. All matches played on or after the third Saturday in August shall commence at 1.00 p.m.

  Prompt starts are essential and the toss for innings shall take place at least fifteen minutes before the scheduled starting time. In the event of a team not being able to comply, the opposing team may, if it so wishes, exercise the right to claim the toss. Clubs who arrive late without satisfactory explanation will be dealt with by the Management Committee who may deduct points from the record of the offending club.

  At the outset of play a match must consist of a minimum of 20 processed.
- At the outset of play a match must consist of a minimum of 80 overs and a maximum of 100 overs.
- The side batting first may receive a maximum of half of the allotted overs. The side batting second shall utilise the balance of the overs not used by the side batting first. For this purpose the last over of the first innings shall be counted as a complete over.
- counted as a complete over. In conjunction with the scorers, the umpires shall ensure that the recording of overs and runs is correctly made and adequately displayed. Before the first ball of the last over of each innings, the umpires shall call "last over" clearly so that both sides understand. Immediately upon the conclusion of each innings the scorers and umpires shall agree the accuracy of the recorded scores.
- recorded scores.

  Captains may agree to reduce the overs before the toss takes place if, in their opinion, the weather conditions so indicate. In these circumstances the provisions of Rule 5 will have no bearing unless 30 minutes have been lost after the start of play. The minimum number of overs to constitute a match shall be 80 overs.
- 4.9 No match shall start later than 3 hours after the official starting time.
  4.10 In all Divisions, teams must use at least four bowlers in their allotted overs, four of whom must bowl a minimum of three overs each. No bowler may bowl more than 20 overs. (Experimental rule for 1999 season.)

### 5. INTERRUPTION OF PLAY

- INTERRUPTION OF PLAY
  5.1 In the event of interference by weather, light or other unforeseen circumstances amounting to 30 minutes or more after the scheduled starting time, play shall cease at 8.30 p.m. (7.30 p.m. on or after the third Saturday in August) or on the completion of the final 20 overs, or on the completion of the number of overs that constitute that particular match, with the final 20 overs, as per the Laws of Cricket, commencing at 7.30 p.m. (6.30 p.m. on or after the third Saturday in August).
  5.2 If an interruption of play occurs during the final 20 overs, the number of overs will be reduced by one over for every full three minutes lost and if the reduced number of overs is completed before 8.30 p.m. (7.30 p.m. on or after the third Saturday in August), and unless the number of overs constitute the conclusion of the particular match, play will continue until 8.30 p.m. (7.30 p.m. on or after the third Saturday in August), or on the completion of the number of overs calculated to be bowled in the last hour, whichever shall be the later.
  5.3 If the teams are off the field of play at the scheduled closing times detailed
- If the teams are off the field of play at the scheduled closing times detailed above, play shall be abandoned.
- If the side batting second do not receive as many overs as the side batting first then the game shall be abandoned.
- 5.5 Bonus points accrued during the match will be retained.

ALLOCATION OF POINTS
A maximum of 20 points are available per side, 10 of which are bonus points: 5 batting, 5 bowling.

Bowling bonus points: 1 point for every 2 wickets taken (2, 4, 6, 8 and after that, last wicket).

Batting bonus points: 1 point for reaching 100, 125, 150, 175, up to a maximum of 5 points on reaching 200 runs.

Win: 20 points awarded (includes maximum bonus points).

Lose:

Draw:

Bonus points only.

Bonus points for both sides, plus 10 points divided between the teams, dependent on the closeness of the match.

The 10 points are divided as follows (points for side batting first are shown first):

5–5 if the scores are tied:
6–4 if 90% or more of the first innings total is scored;
17–3 if 80% or more of the first innings total is scored;
18–2 if 70% or more of the first innings total is scored;
19–1 if 60% or more of the first innings total is scored;
10–0 if less than 60% of the first innings total is scored.

Three points to each side plus bonus points.

Abandoned: Three points to each side plus bonus points.

Abandoned: Three points to each side plus bonus points.

Not Started: Three points to each side.

In the event of a declaration only wickets taken qualify for bowling bonus points.

When calculating bowling bonus points, the wicket of a batsman who has "Retired, Not Out" (as defined in Law 2.9) has not fallen.

IHE BALL

In Division One, two new balls, specified by and purchased through the League, shall be used in every game. Each team shall provide one ball.

In all other divisions, one new ball, spewcified by and purchased through the League, shall be used in every game. The ball shall be provided by the home team.

The cost of League balls shall be notified to member clubs and payment shall be made to the Treasurer by the due date. (See also Rule 14.3.)

### UMPIRES

- 8.1 All teams should endeavour to provide an umpire in all League games.
  8.2 If one side provides an umpire and the other side does not, that one umpire shall be the official umpire for the match and shall stand at the bowler's end throughout the match.
  8.3 Umpires may comment on the co-operation of teams and captains on the official League Score Sheet.

### PITCHES

- Matches will normally be played on grass pitches. In exceptional circumstances the League may consent to a team playing all its home matches on an artificial pitch.
- pitcn.

  9.2 A match may be played on an artificial pitch, by agreement between the captains, when conditions would otherwise prevent the game being played.

  9.3 Preparation of pitches must be in accordance with the M.C.C. Laws and instruction. Pitches should not be watered in the 48-hour period preceding any match.
- Pitches may be wholly covered at all times where possible. Before the toss is made, the home captain should advise his opposite number whether covers are available.

### 10. CANCELLATION OF MATCHES

In the event of any ground being unfit for play owing to weather or other circumstances it shall be the responsibility of the home club to inform the visiting club of this fact. (See also Rule 3.5.)

This should be carried out on the day of the match not before 11.00 a.m., and not later than 12.00 noon (10.00 a.m. and 11.00 a.m. from the third Saturday in August).

### 11. NOTIFICATION OF RESULTS

NOTIFICATION OF RESULTS
11.1 It shall be the responsibility of the home club to complete an official League Score Sheet. The Score Sheet shall contain full details of the game, including the names of ALL players, and shall be signed by both captains and, where appropriate, the umpires.

11.2 The Score Sheet MUST reach the League Secretary by the first post on the Thursday after the match has been played. Failure to comply with this Rule will result in points being deducted from the offending club.
Note: Clubs should make every effort to notify the press of the result of their game in time for publication. See page 25 for list of phone and fax numbers.

### 12, PROTEST

- 12.1 Any protest shall be lodged with the League Secretary in writing within four days following the match.
- 12.2 A copy of such protest shall be sent to the club against whom the protest is made.
- 12.3 Each protest is to be accompanied by a fee of £10 which shall be forfeited if the Disputes Sub-Committee deems the protest to be trivial.
- 12.4 The club sustaining the protest or objection may have points added to its total points gained, but such points shall not exceed the maximum for a win. (See also Rule 3.4.)
- 12.5 When making a protest clubs shall state under which rule the protest is being made.
- 12.6 Clubs or players who are the subject of protests or disputes may be required to attend the hearing of that protest or dispute.
- 12.7 Any dispute having reference to the Laws of Cricket shall be referred to the appropriate national body for settlement and their decision shall be final; in all other matters the decision of the League shall be final;

### 13. LEAGUE POSITIONAL PLACINGS

In the event of two or more teams finishing the season on the same number of points, the following factors shall be used to determine final placings:

- The highest number of wins;
  The lowest number of defeats;
  The highest number of batting bonus points;
  The highest number of batting bonus points;
  The highest number of bowling bonus points; and
  The number of points gained by the teams in matches played between them during the season.

### 14. FINES AND SURCHARGES

- 14.1 Any club which has not paid its subscription by the due date (see Rule 1) shall be liable to a surcharge of £5 per team for every month or part of a month that he is expense. that it is in arrears.
- 14.2 Any club which fails to fulfil a League fixture shall be fined E10 for a first offence, E25 for a second offence and shall face expulsion from the League for a third offence.
- 14.3 Any club which has not paid its allocaation of League balls by the due date (see Rule 7) shall be liable to a surcharge of £10 per team.

### LAW 42.9 "FAST HIGH FULL PITCHES"

Law 42.9 has been revised and takes effect this season. Captains should take note of the changes and make the players aware of them: umpires should apply them.

the changes and make the players aware of them; umpires should apply them.

Until 1998, a fast high full pitch was defined as one which "passes, or would have passed, on the full above waist height of a Batsman standing upright at the crease". Law 42.9 instructed that "either Umpire shall call and signal 'No Ball' and adopt the procedure of caution, final warning, action against the Bowler and reporting as set out in Law 42.8 'The Bowling of Fast Short-Pitched Balls'."

Law 42.9 has been amended with effect from 1st October 1998, having first been tried out in the First Class game, and is to be applied by Umpires throughout the Shropshire Cricket League Sponsored by Banks's with effect from the 1999 season.

The changes are given in items 1, 2, and 4 below fitem 3 is basically the "old" law.

The call of "No Ball" for a high full pitch will in future be made only by the Bowler's-end Umpire; in case of doubt, however, the Striker's-end Umpire may be consulted to confirm the height of the delivery.

For every high full pitch, even though it may be wide of the striker and may not be fast, the Bowler's-end Umpire shall call and signal "No Ball". No further action is required.

action is required.

If, however, the delivery is a fast high full pitch, the Bowler's-end Umpire shall not only call and signal "No Ball" but shall also set in train the procedure of caution, final warning, action against the Bowler and reporting as set out in Law 42.8. On each subsequent occasion that the bowler delivers a last high full pitch, the Umpire shall take the procedure one stage further.

In deciding whether the delivery is "fast" the Umpire shall take into account how much time the striker has to deal with such a potentially lethal delivery and also the level of skill and expertise of the striker. (The threshold for a young or lower-order batsman will clearly be set lower than for a seasoned and skilled one.)

If, in the opinion of the Bowler's-end Umpire, a fast high full pitch is bowled deliberately at the striker, he/she shall call and signal "No Ball" and shall direct the Capitain of the fielding side to take the bowler off forthwith, without going through the stages of caution and final warning.

Whilst it is recognised that the new Law 42.9 imposes a very severe penalty on fielding sides, this is quite deliberate and is designed to try and eradicate this dangerous bowling from the game.

An Umpire will not impose this sanction lightly but should not hesitate to do so if he/she considers it warranted.







### KNOCKOUT COMPETITION RULES

### GENERAL

The purpose of the Competition is to enable teams from member clubs of all Divisions to play each other in an eleven-a-side evening knock-out tournament. The Competition is intended to provide additional cricket for those players who play regularly for their club in its League matches during the season.

### **ORGANISATION**

- Entry to the competition is by invitation from the Management Committee. Clubs will be allocated into one of four zones on a geographical basis and will play each other in accordance with the draw, and in the specified weeks, as published in the League Handbook.
- The winning team from each zone will go forward into the semi-finals.

### **ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS**

- All players must be bona fide members of the club for which they play in the Competition and must be registered with the League in accordance with Rule 3 of the League's "Rules and Playing Arrangements".
- To qualify to play in the Second and later rounds of the Competition, all players must have taken part in at least 20% of their club's Shropshire Cricket League Sponsored by Banks's matches played before that round. (Note: A League match which has been abandoned without a ball being bowled does not count when determining a player's eligibility.)
- No player may take part in the Competition if he plays in any other League on
- No player may play for more than one club in the Competition.
- PROVIDED application is made to the Chairman of the Knock-out Competition Sub-Committee NOT LESS THAN SEVEN DAYS BEFORE the match is due to be played, explaining the reasons for the request, the League Knock-out Sub-Committee is prepared to consider a relaxation of Rule 3.2 when:—
  - (a) a club is genuinely unable to raise a full team of eligible players for a particular match;
  - particular match;
    (b) a club wishes to include a player who is unable to play for his club on Saturdays (provided Rule 3.3 does not apply in his case).

    Any club found to have used an ineligible player will be expelled from the competition and may be debarred from entry in subsequent years.

### MATCH ARRANGEMENTS (EXCEPT THE FINAL)

- Matches shall be played on the ground chosen by the home side.

  Matches shall be played during the specified week on an evening mutually agreed between the two clubs. It is the responsibility of the home team to contact the visiting team to agree the date and inform them of the venue.

  If clubs can not agree the date of their match, the Knock-out Competition Sub-Committee will instruct them when it shall be played and its decision will be binding on both clubs. 4.2
- If any club fails to fulfil a fixture without giving at least 48 hours notice to the opposing team it will be expelled from the Competition and the match will be awarded to the opposing team.
- If bad weather prevents a match being played or completed during the specified week, the clubs must re-arrange it immediately to take place not later than the following week and the home club must notify the Chairman of the Knock-out Competition Sub-Committee of the revised date within 24 hours.

  No match, other than one re-arranged in accordance with rule 4.5, shall be played after the specified week.

- If any match is not played by the latest permitted date without good reason both clubs shall be expelled from the competition.
- 4.8 Matches shall commence at 6.30 p.m. and prompt starts are essential. 38

- 4.9 Each side shall have one innings consisting of a maximum of twenty six-ball overs. If there is a late start or if weather conditions make this desirable, the captains may, before the toss takes place, agree to reduce the number of overs.
  4.10 The toss for innings shall take place not later than 6.20 p.m. In the event of a team not complying with this, the opposing team may, if it so wishes, claim the toss.

  1.12 The match ball shall be provided by the home side; it shall be approved by both capitalis before the toss and used throughout the game. It need not be new but must be of good quality and in good condition.

  1.14 The interval between innings shall not exceed ten minutes.

  1.15 No appeal against the light is allowed after the commencement of the second innings unless the umpires decide that it would be unreasonable or dangerous for play to continue.

  4.16 A match is won by the side scoring the greater number of runs in the agreed overs: If the scores are level, the side which has lost fewer wickets shall be the winner; if the number of wickets taken is also equal, the side scoring the greater number of runs after half the agreed overs have been bowled shall be the winner. If these also are the same, the winner shall be decided by the toss of a

  1.17 It shall be the responsibility of the winning club to ensure that a fully completed official Shropshire League Knock-out Score Sheet, signed by both captains and umpires, is sent to the League Secretary, to arrive not later than two days after the match was played. Captains should note that the names of all players must appear on the Score Sheet, together with the number of matches which each player has played with that club in the League in the current season prior to the match.
- 4.18 The League Secretary will inform clubs who their opponents will be in the next round and will send an official Score Sheet to the home side.
