Transmission of Covid-19 before match play	Players and Officials	Everyone attending an organised cricket activity should carry out a self-assessment for COVID symptoms before leaving home and follow NHS self-isolation procedures if symptomatic. No one required to self isolate should attend an organised cricket activity. Players are made aware the must maintain social distancing of 1m+ when they arrive at the ground. Players and Officials will be ready changed in appropriate clothing before the game starts. Players and officials will be told not to share transport to the game. When players arrive at the ground players will sanitise their hands. Player's arrival time will not be longer than needed and there will be a prompt game start. Placing the stumps into the ground is the umpire's job before the game – players should not touch the stumps. Umpire	Stumps will be left in a place for only the umpire to pick up and place in the ground. Umpires should have their own hand sanitiser to take onto the pitch. Sanitiser to be provided in a range of off field and on field areas. QR codes to be placed in a range of places (toilets, outside doors, laminated on tables) New members/ teams travelling to the club will be told the Covid-19 protocols QCC has in place and expectations when they are on site.



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		should sanitise hands before and after touching the stumps and bails. Players and at least one member of every party or visitors (parents) must complete contact details record by scanning the NHS test and trace QR code that will be displayed around several places of the pavilion and will be given to the captain of the opposing team on arrival.	
Transmission of Covid-19 during cricket on-field activity (match, training)	Players, officials and spectators	Matches: Everyone should maintain social distancing whilst on the pitch wherever possible. The following circumstances allow players to be closer than 1m+: 1) Wicket keepers standing up to stumps 2) Distance between slip fielders Players will not hand any items of clothing to the umpires they should place them on the side of the boundary. All players will sanitise their hands every 6 overs. During the sanitise breaks the ball will be wiped down with a wipe. Players should have their own drink and should not share a cup or drink at intervals. No sweat or saliva is to be applied to the ball at any time. When players leave the playing field they will wipe down and sanitise and playing equipment that may have been touched by the ball e.g. bats and wicket keeping gloves	Sanitiser needs to be available for all players at the edge of the pitch along with wipes for the ball. Wipes should also be made available to be able to wipe the ball and stumps down. The umpires should have their own hand sanitiser. Teams will have a designated space available for the home team and away team. A scorer may use the scoring box, however due to electronic scoreboard the scorers are able to score outside on a suitable bench/ table.



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		One scorer should be the scorer's box and the door should be keep open to allow ventilation. If during the game there is rain and the players have to come off they should return to their own cars. Players who are playing and the officials will be recorded on play cricket. This will allow the club to acknowledge who was at the ground on that date of the game played. If the ball should go by a spectator they should not touch the ball. Only a player on the field should touch the ball. There should be no sharing of equipment, especially of helmets. Training: Junior and adult training will use the two pitches to maximise space between groups of children.	
Transmission of Covid-19 off the field	Players and officials	Players when leaving the pitch should clean their hands with sanitiser. The ball and equipment should be wiped down before being placed away. Players may remain after the game to socialise and should continue to socially distance with people in groups of no more than 6. Players are not permitted to use the showers after the game. Off the field, social distancing and legal gathering size limits must be observed:	Spread out tables and chairs that are available outside to allow for social distancing to be followed – not more than 6 chairs per group. Before players arrival all to be wiped down and cleaned with antibacterial spray/wipes.



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		1b means the rule of 6 or a group of two households (the two households could be larger than 6) Players should bring their own food and drink, drinks bottles should not be shared. Spectators are not permitted in any indoor or outdoor facility in step 1B (Adults may supervise under 18s in a safeguarding role – they should not mix with others) Training: Junior training will use the two pitches to maximise space between groups. Parents will be advised to spectate in a safe zoned area close to where their child is participating. Parents and Guardians will be expected to remain socially distanced and in groups 6 or 2 households. On training	After players leave all to be wiped down and cleaned with antibacterial spray/wipes.
Transmission of Covid-19 through the use of the Cricket Pavilion	Players, officials, and spectators	Step 1B Clubhouses including social and hospitality facilities must remained closed, but toilet and hand washing facilities is permitted. There will be an entry point for toilet facilities, hand sanitiser will be available outside the toilets and inside the toilets to reduce transmission. When using the toilet facilities, one of the two doors will be kept open to reduce contact of door handles. People are advised to wash their hands and use sanitiser before leaving the toilet facilities. The amount of people allowed in the pavilion at one time will be 6 when using toilet facilities.	Hand sanitiser outside the pavilion Hand sanitiser and soap available in the toilets. Increase amount of signs around the club – signs will be on doors and on entry and exit of the club house. Spectators should return to cars and should not seek shelter in the pavilion.



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		Toilets access points, surfaces and sinks will be cleaned regularly throughout on field cricket activity. When using toilet facilities players, spectators should wear a mask to reduce transmission where social distancing may be more difficult.	Signs up supporting the use of masks indoors.
		Step 2 12 th April: Hospitality The pavilion will remain closed, however the sliding doors will be open with a row of tables to allow 1m+ people will be served by bar staff (wearing masks) and drinks will be placed on table to collect and payments will be made by card to reduce contact. There will be hand sanitiser available on tables and outside there will be 2m markings to reduce transmission. The kitchen should not be used by anyone unless attending for first aid or are working behind the bar. The bar staff should wash their hands regularly and use hand sanitiser when serving behind the bar. Before opening the pavilion hard surfaces will be cleaned.
