		Access to the toilets will be: In through the 'Away' Changing Room and out through the 'Home' Changing Room. There will be a signed one-way system and a 2m distancing practice maintained. Should it be necessary a queue for the toilets may occur and people in the queue must maintain the 2-metres distancing requirements. There will be 2-metres markers set on the floor to aid this. At most there will be 4 people in the clubhouse at any one time, the scorer and those using the toilets, 1 in the toilet 2 in the queue.

Should any equipment be shared it must be disinfected prior to use by another person See Welsh Assembly Guidelines – Guidance for Sports.

The Clubhouse	All Users	The Clubhouse is not to be used, with the exception bar staff and those accessing toilet facilities. There will be 2 members of staff who may access the bar area for the purposes of providing drinks, receiving payment and washing glasses.	
The Social Area	All Users	Prior to the match, the car park area adjacent to the Clubhouse is to be coned or taped off to prevent vehicular access. This area together with the balcony and the path along the front of the Clubhouse be designated as the Social Area. In the car park area a maximum of 5 tables will be placed, at a minimum of 4-metres apart. Chairs will be placed around the tables in the Social Area with a maximum of 6 per table. The maximum number of people allowed in the Social Area at any one time is 30.	
Access to the female toilets	All users	Access will be from outside, up the external steps, along the balcony, through the patio doors and to the toilets. Egress will be down the internal stairs and out through the rear door. A signed one-way system will be in operation. Only 1 person will be allowed in the toilet at one time.	
Access to the male toilets	All Users	Access will be from outside, through the Away Changing room to the toilet. Egress will be via the home changing room . A signed one-way system will be in operation. A maximum of 2 people will be allowed in the toilet area at one time, maintaining a 2-metre separation.	
General	All Users	When queueing all people must remain 2-metres apart. Guidelines will be placed on the floor to accommodate this.
